## **DATES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS 2025** – 7.30pm in Fanshaws Room (the Village Hall)

## 27 March – 22 May – 24 July – 25 September – 27 November

### Parish Council meeting 23 January 2025 – main points of discussion:

- District Councillor Tim Hoskin gave a report on the government's proposal for devolution of local councils in England and directed parishioners to a White Paper on this topic on the government website.
- The PC are still waiting on permissions, and finding a suitable installer, for the two new defibrillators
- Purchase of Brickendon Green is moving forward after experiencing delays due to legal issues
- LITTER PICK will now take place on Sunday 23 March, 10am meet in Brickendon Green car park
- A contract has been agreed for replacing the fencing around Brickendon Green
- No crime was reported in the parish during November 2024 but two attempted burglaries were reported in Brickendon in December with damage caused to the lock of an outbuilding. The PC discussed installing surveillance equipment to identify fly tippers in the parish.\*
- On **Tuesday 4 February** Countryside Management Services will be clearing around the pond on Brickendon Green, and along the old wall <u>helpers with this initiative will be very welcome, 10am start</u>.

### Fanshaws Room Committee 16 January 2025 – main points of discussion:

- After expenses were met, a profit of a little short of £3,500 was made from the 2024 Fete. The date for the 2025 Fete and Dog Show is **Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> September**
- There is a serious water leak in the hall which appears to be due to roof issues remedial work will be carried out asap
- The tennis court maintenance is to be reduced from four to three times per year. Negotiations are in place to include Bayford residents in the greater use of the courts and to promote its availability. Just now no further change of use is planned, although the inclusion of basketball nets and netball facilities was briefly discussed.
- 25 children attended the under 8yr olds Christmas Party at PWP and it was considered a highly successful event.
- 10 'senior citizens' enjoyed a Christmas lunch at the Farmer's Boy and some others received a Christmas hamper
- Discussion took place on a summer event to celebrate 80 years since the end of WWII. Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> June was decided a suitable date between VE and VJ days. More information will be provided to residents when plans are finalised.

• The next meeting of FRC is on 6<sup>th</sup> March at 7pm – venue to be confirmed.

The Tuesday Knit and Natter and the Bayford Knitting group, both of whom meet in the Farmers Boy PH, knitted Gingerbread Houses and Gingerbread Men that were used to decorate a Christmas tree at the Ponsbourne Christmas Tree Festival. After the festival the Christmas tree was donated to Brickendon chapel, along with some of the Gingerbread Houses and Gingerbread Men.

The rest of the knitted items were put up for sale in The Farmers Boy with donations to the local charity CHIPS (they offer play schemes and social opportunities for children with special needs, and their siblings). We are delighted that £84.84 was raised for this very worthwhile charity.

#### Two iconic Brickendon buildings with a shared history:

Brickendon Grange, now the home of the golf club, and Fanshaws, the home of the IMI, have a shared history. A gentleman called Henry Demain Saunders rented the Grange in times past and legend has it that he was concerned that the staircase would prove a challenge to bringing him downstairs if he died in his bed. He therefore had Fanshaws built, in the late 19c, with its grander, and wider, staircase, although his real reason for moving may well have been to have his own place, and somewhere somewhat more palatial. However, it's a fun story. The gentleman in question owned half the land round the village, including Bentleys Farm and Hacketts. A footnote to the story is that he, allegedly, died in Bayford church. *(Graham Irwin)*
